### Workshops

We are changing the way you book and pay for workshops from September. The reason for these changes is to prevent overcrowded workshops. In the past some members have turn up on the day without letting Julie know they are still coming or having paid. Oversubscribed workshops make it very difficult for the visiting artist to give you the attention you deserve.

Julie will be in touch to remind you that you have booked a workshop place between 3 to 4 weeks before the date.

You will be required to confirm and pay for your place either by bank transfer into the CAS account or by cheque to Julie by **two weeks** before the workshop date. You can, of course, pay in advance of this date if you wish.

If you have not paid by the required date, it will be assumed that you no longer want your place and it will be offered to the person on the top of the waiting list. If you know you will be unable to attend in advance of Julie contacting you, please inform Julie so that she can take your name off the list and give your place to someone else. We know emergencies happen at the last minute and we completely understand that this is out of your control. If you have already paid you will be offered a credit note for another workshop of your choice, or a refund.
